INTRODUCTION

God has given us three resources to produce growth in our Christian life and walk. First, He gave the Word of God which lays out the guidelines by which we should live. Second, He gave the people of God so we could be nourished and encouraged through fellowship with other believers. Third, He gave the Spirit of God, better known as the Holy Spirit, to empower us in our walk as a Christian.

All three are extremely important for Christian growth. In order for us to benefit from these resources, we must have a basic understanding of each. God's Word sets down the guidelines and principles whereby we, as children of God, can experience the blessings that God intended to give us through these resources.

The Holy Spirit's ministry in our life as believers is of utmost importance. Yet, today there is so much confusion as to who the Holy Spirit is and what is His ministry. It is Satan's strategy to confuse us, thus preventing us from enjoying this resource that God has provided for us.

As you work through this lesson, study carefully the ministry of the Holy Spirit, so you can understand His part in your life. The Holy Spirit's ministry in your life is rich and full, bringing joy into your life as you walk in His power.

From these passages we can conclude that the Holy Spirit is a <u>person</u>. Personality means He possesses the <u>will</u> (the ability to choose), <u>intellect</u> (the ability to reason and think), and <u>emotion</u> (the ability to feel).
