"How Important is Prayer in My Life?"



Someone once said that a Christian is only as strong as his prayer life. There is a great deal of truth in this because prayer is simply your direct communication with God. When you read the Bible, God speaks to you; when you pray, you speak to God. Your personal relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ cannot grow without proper communication.

The purpose of this lesson is to acquaint you with the basics of a proper prayer life so that the lines of communication between you and God can be open and effective in your life. If you have not done so already, at the onset of this lesson begin to keep a list of your prayer requests and answers to those prayers in your own "prayer book."

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
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INTRODUCTION

Christianity is a personal <u>relationship</u> with a holy and loving God. One of the important elements of any relationship is proper communication. Without proper <u>communication</u> a relationship cannot flourish. Thus, as Christians our communication with God is essential for our growth.

God has created a means in the New Testament whereby He can communicate with us and we can communicate with Him. The <u>Word of God</u> is God's method of speaking to you, and <u>prayer</u> is your means of communicating with God.



In order for us to develop an <u>effective prayer life</u>, it is important that we understand the principles of prayer that are given in the Word of God. As we work through this Bible Study on prayer, we need to learn the principles of prayer and begin to incorporate these guidelines into our life as a child of God.

THE INGREDIENTS OF PRAYER

In Matthew 6:5-15, Jesus gives instructions on the subject of prayer. This passage contains the Lord's Prayer.

Our Father in Heaven, Hallowed be Your name.

Your Kingdom come.

Your will be done
On earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our debts,

As we forgive our debtors.

And do not lead us into temptation,

But deliver us from the evil one.

For Yours is the kingdom, and the power,

And the glory forever. Amen.

This prayer was never intended to be vainly repeated over and over. Jesus taught this in order that He might demonstrate the ingredients that should be in our prayers.

Note carefully the two main ingredients of prayer:

*Praise for God.

Hallowed be Your name Your kingdom come Your will be done...

*Petition for my needs.

Give us...our daily bread ...forgive us our debts... ...do not lead us into temptation etc..

The first part of prayer should be an act of worship on our part. We should express our praise and worship for the character and work of God. Hallowed or holiness is one aspect of God's character.

The first and foremost ingredient of prayer is our expression of praise to God for who He is and what He has done for us. This praise does two things:

- 1. Keeps us looking for what God is doing in our life.
- 2. Keeps God in the place of priority in our life.

In our prayer life we need to express our gratitude for God and His work in our life. If we can think of nothing else for which we can rejoice, we can <u>always</u> thank Him for the salvation He has given us.
