The purpose of this lesson is to acquaint you with the teaching of the New Testament regarding spiritual gifts. Then, you must begin to use those gifts to serve God through your local church.

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INTRODUCTION

One of the great truths of the Bible is God wants to use us to carry out His work. The Bible teaches that God uses people to perform His work.

As Christians, God wants to use US. He could have chosen others who are more qualified, who have greater potential, but God wants us.

Not only does God want us to serve Him, but through this lesson we will see from Scripture that He has given us ability to serve. Spiritual gifts are special abilities which are given to every Christian for service and are something we did not possess prior to becoming a Christian.

We also possess talents which we have had from birth which can be used for God when we are empowered by the Holy Spirit.

Here are three questions every Christian must face:

- 1. What responsibilities has the Bible given us to perform?
- 2. What gift has God given us to use in service in our church?
- 3. What talents do we possess that can be used for God's glory?

In this lesson we will study about spiritual gifts. Let's look carefully at the principles given in this lesson as we seek to know what God has given us for service.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF SERVICE?

1.	The presence of service should indicate salvation. (Ephesians 2:10)
